

U.S. Constitution

<u>California Education Code Section 44335</u> requires credential candidates to demonstrate knowledge of the United States Constitution by completing a college level course, or a college level examination in the subject. This requirement must be completed before the credential can be granted. The U.S. Constitution requirement can be met by successful completion of **one** of the following:

- 1. Satisfactory completion of a course (at least two semester units) on the provisions and principals of the U.S. Constitution. The course must be from a regionally accredited college or university.
- 2. Pass an examination on the provisions and principals of the U.S. Constitution offered in a college or university. Pacific Oaks offers a U.S. Constitution Exam (see below).

Pacific Oaks College U.S. Constitution Exam:

If you do not meet the U.S. Constitution criteria listed above, you are eligible to take the Pacific Oaks College U.S. Constitution Exam. Instructions are listed below:

Instructions:

- 1. Complete the required exam (essays) in ONE Word document see "Exam" section below.
- 2. <u>Include a title page with the following information:</u>

EXAM:

Choose **four** of the following questions to answer in well-written essays using APA format. Each answer should be between one and two pages (typed).

- 1. Explain in detail the operation of the bicameral legislature, including advantages and disadvantages of it, and special areas of control of each house.
- 2. What is the system of "checks and balances"? Explain in detail how it works.
- 3. What is the Bill of Rights? How did it originate and why?
- 4. What powers do state governments have? Explain in detail.
- 5. Explain in detail how the federal budget is made up, approved, and administered.
- 6. Explain in detail how the judicial system functions.

EVALUATION: Your work will be evaluated by a faculty member as "Passed" or "Not Passed." You will receive notification of your exam status. If your exam is "Not Passed" you may revise and resubmit.
